

Bob also runs tournaments at Sherwood and Coldwater.


Bob won 1st place in class D-2 at the State Tournament in 1988.

He has been pitching horseshoes for more than seven years and pitches the year around. One of the Places he competes is at the indoor horseshoe courts in Jackson.
