The main event in St. Clair Shores, the state doubles championship, takes on competition with the best doubles teams in the state.

Don't like to walk after your shoes? Well, how about a little walking if you can pitch your own shoes and not that of your partners? That has been a common complaint with sanctioned pitchers who like to pitch their favorite shoes.

Walking doubles has two opponents stationed at one stake with their partners at the opposite stake. One pair of partners compete as a unit against the other. They alternate pitch for fairness, walk to the opposite end, call the score, and pitch back until each team has thrown 50 count-all shoes.

If you have competed in one sanctioned tournament since the last doubles event, all you have to do is grab a partner or have one assigned to you. It is all in fun, we are all out to win, but the day we chose to pitch horse-shoes proves that people do truly pitch for the love of the sport.

Editor's Notes

It's getting close for all MHPA pitchers to sign up for the World Horseshoe Pitching Tournament to be held in our back yard. You will not be sorry for the great experience, but you will be if you do not participate.

I was an inexperienced pitcher when I pitched in my first WT in Greenville, OH. I had no idea that I was going to horseshoe pitching heaven until I got there. I signed up right after I had my first major GIST cancer operation in March 1999. I wore a belly brace to keep the tissue from popping. I was placed in a round robin of 16 pitchers from all over the country. We all had a ringer percent within 29.00%. All were very polite gentlemen and some handed out pins representing their states. I had no idea what to expect, but I hope I was gracious.

I was so over taken by at the atmosphere that I toured every building at the fairgrounds where the pitching activity took place. This was the last WT not to be held inside in controlled temperatures. It was hot. There was a playoff building, a publicity building and another for cities wanting to hold the next WT.

I stayed in a motel near I-75 and drove for about 30 minutes each day to the venue. My first pitching day was quite an experience. I couldn't remember if I was playing league play with alternating pitch until my opponent told me the rules. I was 4-1. The second day was good to me with a 5-0 record. Each day we pitched in another building. The last day was in the pig barn with posts near each court. Some pitchers didn't like the raised pits, but I sure did. Everything was consistent and well set up. I didn't do so well on the third day 3-2. I thought that might be good enough to finish high in the standings. After my last game and being beaten by a fellow throwing 50% against me, I was on the way to my car to change my sweaty shirt when someone called out, "Hey Dean, You are in a playoff with a three way tie. Report to the playoff building."

Again, I didn't know what to expect. High % pitcher sits out, that was me. Number two and three pitch first. I sat down with a small group to watch the first game. I leaned over to the guy sitting next to me and said, "I know who will win this game, the fellow who pitched 50% against me."

Sure enough, my prediction was right. I had time watching the first game to think about the fundamentals of the game. Get set, aim, easy back swing, lift, follow through and keep my eyes on the stake at all times. My brain and body got together in the last game. I turned the tide on him and pitched a 50% game. I met him again at another WT, but didn't pitch him. We talked about horseshoes. A few years later, I read his obituary in the Ohio Newsletter. Sad, he was a young fellow and a great competitor.

We only have one chance in life. Now is the time to take that chance by signing-up and pitching in the WT hosted by our MHPA and the City of Lansing.

The SCSHC Memorial Tournament honors deceased pitchers who has been members of the MHPA since 2000.

After the SCSHC pavilion was built in 2008, members decided that the north end of it would be a great way to post names of those we remember.

The SCSHC pays for the name plates that are posted and if good calculations matter, there are 102 name plates with over \$866 invested by the club.

This year's tournament is June 3. If anyone wants to try pitching in a sanctioned tournament, now is your chance.

Walk-on's can come early and pitch 100 shoes to be seated in a round robin. Trial Members pay \$0 membership, but must pay the tournament entry fee of \$15. They will be allowed to play in only one tournament. After the trial, you will be hooked on our brand of horseshoe pitching and join the NHPA/MHPA with a \$45 fee at the next tournament.

World Tournament Dress Code

All contestants competing in a World Tournament shall have, as a minimum, their last name and State or Country abbreviation professionally lettered on the back of their shirts. Said shirts cannot be sleeveless. No cut-offs are permitted and closed-toe shoes must be worn. Further dress code restrictions may be imposed by the Executive Council if all entrants are notified no later than the mailing date of their pitching schedules. This Dress Code may also be adopted into any Charter Bylaws or may be enforced at any State Championship Tournament or at any local tournament, if announced in advance by the Tournament/League Officials. Contestants who do not comply may not be allowed to participate in the event.

friends and family, and it's a fun way

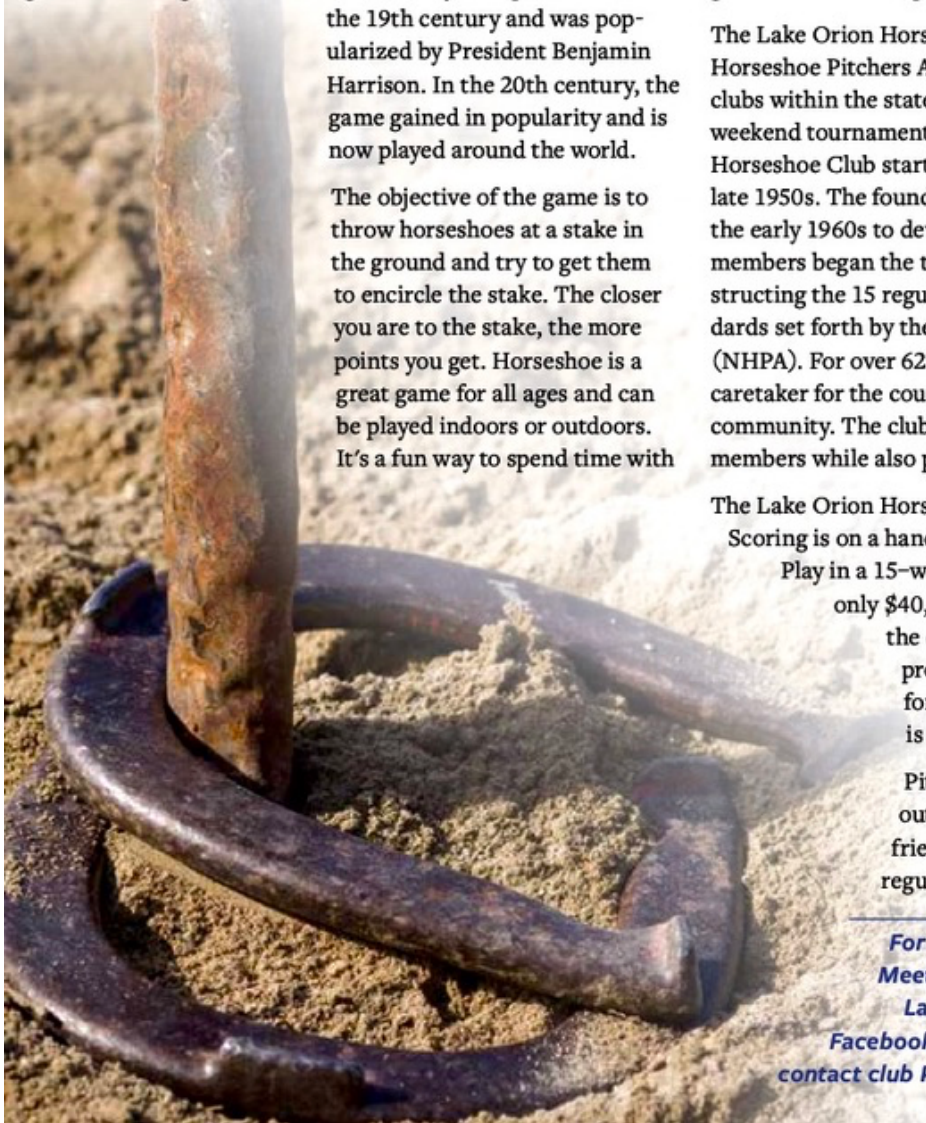
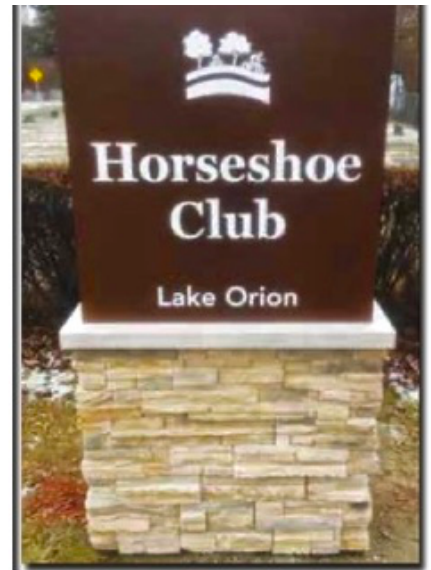
to challenge yourself and improve your aim. Whether you're playing for fun or as part of a competition, horseshoe is a great game that's sure to provide hours of entertainment.

Celebrating A Backyard Game

You may think playing horseshoes is kept to backyards, during afternoon barbecues or graduation parties, something your favorite uncle does but you would never think to do. Well, you are wrong, especially if you live in St. Clair Shores.

The St. Clair Shores Horseshoe Club (SCSHC) recently celebrated 30 years of pitching at Kyte-Monroe Park located near Masonic and Harper. Since 2001, the club has been managed by President John Thomachefski and he says that members have a high level of passion for horseshoe pitching with outstanding sportsmanship. The executive committee leads by example and promotes camaraderie.

Their summer league fees are \$50 for the year, allowing members to pitch in all three leagues. The season starts the first Monday in May and lasts until Labor Day weekend. They have a Monday summer singles recreation league at 6:30p.m. for serious players. It is a good league for the novice pitcher who would like to learn the game or for those with experience. They play four games of 32 horseshoes each.

The SCSHC has a co-ed Tuesday summer recreation league and a fall doubles league at 6:30p.m. that boasts 24 teams. The fall league starts the first Tuesday after Labor Day. "Our Tuesday night doubles league is our bread and butter," says Thomachefski. "It is the best club in Michigan, and we are glad St. Clair Shores (SCS) is supportive." The SCS Recreation Department used a federal grant to construct 12 horseshoe courts with groomed clay lined pits.

The SCSHC maintains the courts where members can improve their skills and techniques. Many of their pitchers are members of the Michigan Horseshoe Pitchers Association (MHPA). This creates more opportunities for a sense of community through state-sanctioned tournaments on Saturdays. This organization is for people who enjoy playing horseshoes and want to participate in organized events and competitions.

There is also a SCSHC Thursday night summer sanctioned league. The sanctioned league requires SCSHC members to pay an additional \$45 MHPA membership fee. "I am proud of the executive committee for continuing our growth with recruitment of new members by word of mouth," says Dean Schmitz, SCSHC sanctioned league director. "This club is keeping horseshoe pitching alive when cornhole and pickleball are becoming more popular."

Schmitz says that members enjoy traveling and meeting members from other horseshoe clubs through various competitive tournaments in Michigan. Socializing and making new friends is the main reason people join. Members love the outdoor game of horseshoes. They even have their own club jackets, shirts, patches, koozies, decals, towels, and other horseshoe paraphernalia.
