This year's WT format has changed. They flipped the weeks so keep that in mind when entering. If you pitched in the 1st week you will now pitch the second week.

The 2024 World Tournament is in Tri-Cities Washington. July 29-Aug. 10, 2024. Deadline is May 20th. You can also go to the NHPA website for more information.

All adults must have pitched in a minimum of four (4) sanctioned events in the twelve (12) months prior to May 20th, 2024, in the same division you are entering. Only one (1)

entering. Only one (1) event is required for Juniors. All averages used will be the average on record in eShoe as of May 20th, 2024.

Reminder: You need four "MHPA" tournaments since the 2023 state to qualify for the 2024 State. The 2023 state tournament does not count.

"Most of us know that our leadership, the NHPA, has made some tough decisions recently. The World Tournament will be held out West, at least 4 of the next 5 years, hard to understand. But I'm sure they have their reasons. Also, the World Tournament schedule format will change drastically. Change is difficult. And because none of us are part of the inner circle of the NHPA, we cannot truly know why they are doing what they are doing. So, a lot of negative things are being spoken by pitchers, not only in Wisconsin but in several other charters also. And I am hearing that many who used to head out to World Tournaments are now calling the WT quits." —NHPA Chaplain Ken Heinritz, WI

Constitution Changes Starting 1/1/2024

Rule change regarding the pitchers with ringer percentages under 25%, 30 points or 40 shoes, whichever comes first. That is probably the biggest change and we (as an association) will need to make sure we start off on the right foot with enforcing and staying consistent with it. I know as we have more tournaments it will become old hat. However, old habits die hard too.

For example: court\site preparation, food\concessions on site, the Saturday dinner, raising of funds for a Championship class etc.

If your next court is open after you complete a game let's move to it and begin pit preparation. Once your scorekeeper is ready and your next opponent has arrived let's begin pitching.

I understand we all want to talk to our friends and socialize. I'm not saying we should take that aspect out of the game. Let's not allow that to delay the playing of our games.

efficient way to operate the club. We groom the courts every spring with a discount in fees to members who participate. Resetting of pit stakes is done during that time or whenever it needs to be done. We paint the picnic tables and do any repairs needed.

We have reached out to give each new member a club shirt, guide book and a great welcome to the club. We have club jackets, shirts, koozies, etc.

Members participate in our district sanctioned tournaments, state and world tournaments. Participation in the Woody Cup to raise money for St. Jude has become an exciting event for club members.

We have members step up to become officers and shed managers. One of the high-lights is the banquet held under the pavilion in August. During that time we see that everyone gets a delicious meal and plenty of awards. Last year over \$300 was given out in 50-50. The Ted Kowalski "for the love of horseshoe pitching" Award is given out, now over 20 years, with the family presenting the award.

We have banners posted on our fence promoting our sponsors and banners on our shed to promote the NHPA and SCSHC. Last year our State doubles tournament had a record turn-out of over 100 people helping themselves to the tournament meal. Over the years we have had the Recreation Director, Rec. One bright spot of the year 2023 was the World Tournament held in Lansing, Michigan. The facility and the closeness of adequate hotel rooms nearby was very convenient. Our Lansing hosts were exceptional. Anything we needed was provided to make our stay very successful. The attendance exceeded expectations as we received 947 entries. The result was some excellent pitching in all divisions. We should not forget our set-up crew who had all the courts available for starting time. Pep Plummer, Clarence Lassiter, Roger Vogel, and many Michigan charter members helped with this effort. We should also thank Empire Photography and Ron and Polly's Horseshoe Pitching Supplies for their presence at our tournament. Hopefully, Lansing will ask us to return in the future.

Two new rules were passed in 2023 that are worthy of discussion. One rule was allowing women over 65 to pitch up to the 20' line. This will be voted on at the 2024 Convention as to the experimental results that we obtain prior to that date.

Another rule was allowing people from one State to play in the State Tournament of another state under certain difficult circumstances. Difficult circumstances could be driving a long distance in your state when you live and pitch in a neighboring State. Also, people who live in more than one State may choose which state they want to pitch in. The Council has decided that a pitcher should submit evidence as to why they want to pitch in a neighboring State. This rule was not implemented to allow people to switch to another State just because they have a problem with their home State. Let's see how this goes.

Clubs are always looking for ways to grow and recruit new members, there are many things club members can do to attract new members. Here, you'll find a few viable approaches that a local club or organization could use to recruit more members.

- Simply ask someone, such as family members, coworkers.
- Update or improve your charter websites and have them linked to other sports groups or City Parks and Rec. departments and city websites, state Travel and Tourism offices.
- Contact your state Travel and Tourism office (CVB), give a list of all the clubs in your state and physical addresses and GPS information and have them list it on their website. You never know who may be traveling through your state and want to stop and pitch in a tournament.
- If you have any local clubs such as a Rotary Clubs, Masonic Lodges, American Legions, your local schools, churches, send out invitations to pitch on one night a week. "Club vs Club."

- Create a Junior/Cadet group. Have your Junior Directors, if applicable, get into the schools and host a tournament/challenge between the Football Teams and Basketball Teams or other groups in the schools. "Club vs Club" format and bragging rights.
- Advertise in Newspapers & local TV Stations, Radio. Invite these same media people to your tournaments and leagues each week. Create a media contact list.
- Create your own Social Media pages and posts for your own clubs, and charters such as Facebook, Tik-Tok, Instagram, Twitter, etc. Create a Social Media director position in your clubs.
- Have open to the public tournaments. Anyone and any age can pitch,
- Have a booth at malls, local county and state fairs, festivals etc., also hold public exhibitions of pitching on portable pits.
- Place pamphlets/brochures in doctors' offices, hospitals, cafeterias, libraries, local grocery stores, convenience stores, or as inserts into your local newspaper, etc.
- Hold a membership drive, give prizes for the member that recruits the most members to join in a calendar year. Set a goal of how many new members you want to attract this year, Make it a goal.
- Send letters to people in the news with an invitation to visit the club when you're hosting events.

NHPA has a one-time sanctioned tournament with a "Free" trial membership, or you can try the provisional membership as an incentive.

Contact NHPA for more information regarding qualifying exceptions. All averages used will be the average on record in eShoe as of May 20, 2024. Anyone qualifying under an exception must have those scores recorded by the same date. All NHPA and any special lournament rules apply. Please see note regarding refunds

READ CAREFULLY: Any adult male pitching from the full distance platform may enter the OPEN MEN'S DIVISION regardless of age, just as any adult female may enter the OPEN WOMEN'S DIVISION. To enter the SENIOR DIVISION, you must be 60 years of age or older before the end of 2024. Any man that turns 65 years of age in 2024, is older than 65, or has an approved medical exemption may enter the ELDER MEN'S DIVISION. Entrants in the JUNIOR BOY and JUNIOR GIRL DIVISION must be 18 years old or less for the entire 2024 calendar year. CADET BOY AND CADET GIRL DIVISION entrants must be 12 years old or younger for the entire 2023 calendar year.

Note # 1. 30 ft Men with Medical Exemptions must be in eShoe as exempt to pitch in this division.

Note # 2. For class play, a minimum of 48 must enter this division or it will be canceled. All entrants will then pitch in the Open Preliminaries.

Note #3 Junior Boys & Junior Girls divisions will be mixed for preliminary play. Cadet Boys & Cadet Girls divisions will be mixed for Preliminary play.

The pitching schedule will be finalized by May 25, 2024 and published on the NHPA website. If you indicated above to receive the schedule by mail, it will be mailed to the address you have listed above during the second week in June.

Please note: The NHPA reserves the right to disallow your participation for any of the following reasons; any errors on this form, if your records don't appear in eShoe's, any false or misleading information on this form, if the NHPA cannot verify through its established procedure the validity of any Medical Exemption, or for any other reason by majority vote of the NHPA Council.
